Position Background

The Restoration Landscape Architect and Mentor (LA-M) serves as advisor and mentor for Landscape Design restoration staff working to obtain full Landscape Architecture certification. The LA-M will also develop site designs and construction documents for green infrastructure projects. The LA-M assists the restoration team during the investigative, planning, site design, and permit review processes and signs off on final construction documents with oversight from the Restoration Manager.

Job Duties & Responsibilities

Programmatic Coordination and Mentorship

- Serve as advisor and mentor for Landscape Design staff working to obtain Landscape Architect certification.
- Provide technical assistance, support, and training to restoration staff working to develop site designs for green infrastructure projects.
- Review and provide feedback on site assessments, rain garden designs, construction documents, and planting layouts utilizing native plants.
- Ensure site designs meet municipal code and permit requirements.
- Sign off on final construction documents.
- Prepare illustrations for projects, as needed.
- Support the development of meaningful ways to present project information in both formal and informal settings.
- Assist Restoration Manager in programmatic budgeting and project management.

Fiscal Sustainability and Fundraising

- Support FOTR staff in researching and coordinating grant application efforts, including grant writing.
- Pursue corporate sponsorships and donations with direction and oversight from Development team and Restoration Manager.



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- Perform grant writing activities including narrative, budgeting, tracking, and reporting activities.
- Participate in fundraising events.
- Raise 75% of restoration programmatic dollars within 2 years of hire.

General

- Manage time effectively and efficiently; effectively prioritize tasks, attend to a broad and diverse range of activities.
- Track and report activities and time on a daily/weekly/monthly basis.

- Professional licensure in Landscape Architecture.
- Professional work experience as a certified landscape architect.
- Minimum of 7 years' experience in on-the-ground habitat enhancement, restoration projects, designing and installing rain gardens or native landscapes
- Knowledge and experience with municipal codes, ordinances, and permit requirements related to stormwater management and green infrastructure practices.
- Ability to prepare landscape designs (drawings, CAD, or other design software)
- Superior knowledge of their field of work, with specific attention to developing rain garden site designs and construction documents utilizing Michigan native plant species
- Knowledge, interest and experience with soil borings and soil analysis using the Unified Soil Classification System (USCS).
- Knowledge, interest, and experience with infiltration testing.
- Ability to Independently use Microsoft Office and Google Apps.
- Willingness to work a flexible schedule including occasional evenings and weekends.
- Ability to multitask, prioritize and maintain attention to detail.
- Excellent organizational and customer service skills.
- Demonstrate quality project management skills and project planning.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills.
- Highly organized, able to multitask, and attention to detail
- Experience working with diverse people in a variety of settings.
- A positive attitude and enthusiasm to function as a part of a team.

Physical Requirements

Office work will include extended periods of time sitting while using a computer. Ability to hear and listen in English required.

Work Environment

This position is an office position paired with minimal outdoor work. Field work may involve site review of construction documents on uneven ground and steep slopes along the river in all weather conditions. Restoration and cleanup projects take place in neighborhoods and public parks across all communities in the Rouge River watershed. Must be willing to work a flexible schedule including some evenings and weekends. Dress code as described in the Employment and Policies Manual.
