Ralph C. Wilson Grant awarded to FOTR is being finalized. The amount awarded is \$326,000 and will allow for funding of a full time trail manager A new intern was hired to support Rain Gardens to the Rescue and Water Words that Work projects

FOTR now hiring for the Trails coordinator and the job description shared widely. This position will be funded with monies from the National Kidney Foundation for two years.

A Ralph C. Wilson Foundation grant proposal was submitted that would support work on the Rouge Gateway Connector, boat launches at the Bessey Field House in Melvindale and Belanger Park in River Rouge. Funding amount is \$326,000.
